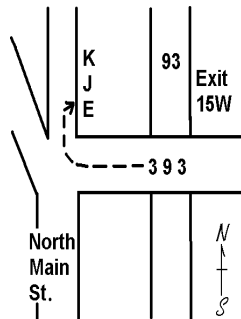

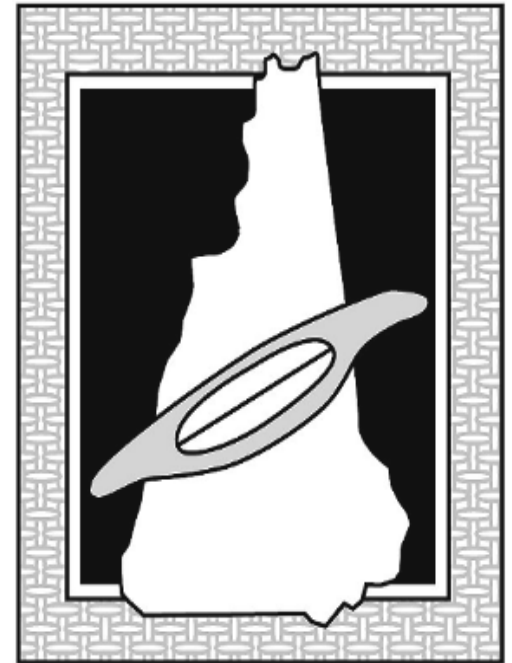

I93 to Exit 15W, 393W to No. Main St.**



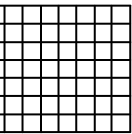
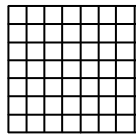
From East: 393W to No. Main St.**
